





THANK YOU FOR 2022!

Three years after reaching nearly 1 million passengers, ABE is continuing the climb towards that milestone.

"Early indications from bookings and flight schedules had us all preparing for a busy year, and that's certainly what happened. Post-pandemic passenger traffic returned to ABE sooner than industry forecasts," said Thomas R. Stoudt. Executive Director. Lehigh-Northampton Airport Authority (LNAA).

912,256 passengers traveled through ABE in 2022 - a 21.2 percent increase from 2021 – surpassing the 2019 total of 911.970.

"2022 produced plenty of accomplishments for Airport staff and stakeholders. We served over 1/4 of a million people during the busiest summer travel season in recent history, added Landline Bus Service through American Airlines and United Airlines (AA to Philadelphia, with UA to Newark), implemented a new system for passengers to check TSA Security Checkpoint Wait Times, and made significant progress on infrastructure improvements," said Stoudt.

STILL ON SCHEDULE

The TSA Checkpoint / Terminal Connector Project at ABE has surpassed the 75-percent mark for overall completion, with the opening expected in June 2023.

This \$35-million infrastructure investment delivers the following enhancements:

- Up to (4) TSA security checkpoint screening lanes
- Improved vertical circulation equipment (elevators and escalators)
- Shorter walking distances with separation of arriving and departing passengers
- Enhanced air purification systems

"This project gives everyone a more convenient route from ticket counter to takeoff," said Stoudt.




HELPING TO SAVE LIVES!
