Lehigh Valley International Airport (ABE) joined Tailwind Hospitality, Inc. for a ribbon cutting ceremony to celebrate the arrival of The Drafthouse at ABE.

"Judging by the number of passengers sitting around the bar, this is quickly becoming a popular destination within the Airport," said Thomas Stoudt, Executive Director, Lehigh-Northampton Airport Authority.

Providing a full menu of food and beverages, The Drafthouse replaces the PA Pub in the Wilfred M. "Wiley" Post Jr. Concourse which opened in 2012.

"When the ABE folks had this tremendous vision to open up the middle of their concourse, it gave us an amazing opportunity to really bring our prototypical bar to life and spread our wings," said Jess Backhaus, Senior Vice President of Operations, Tailwinds Hospitality, Inc.

The Drafthouse operates from 5:00 a.m. (daily) until the last departure.

As the first phase of a major overhaul of new concessions at ABE, there is a lot of excitement surrounding the next few months of construction.

"Besides the new Drafthouse, the list of options will continue to grow with the opening of Which Wich® - and a familiar establishment to Lehigh Valley residents, Zekraft," said Stoudt.

"For families who thought they would never be able to travel by air, this event provides hope. The rehearsal takes place right in their own community and makes air travel a true possibility for them," said Karen Shoemaker, CEO of The Arc of Lehigh and Northampton Counties.

A trademarked program, Wings for All[®] is designed specifically

for individuals with autism and other intellectual and developmental disabilities.

Wings for All® participants experience the following:

- · Check-in at the ticket counter
- Security screening by the Transportation Security Administration (TSA)
- . Boarding a Delta Airlines aircraft
- Tour of the Sensory Room located in the Gate Concourse
- Depart the aircraft and enjoy refreshments during a special reception





For the first time at ABE, Delta Airlines (Endeavor) provided staff and an aircraft for the Wings for All® event.

"At Delta, we believe travel is for everyone, and we're proud to support this program that furthers our ongoing efforts to create a world that is more inclusive and accessible for all," said Brandon Osterman, Delta's Regional Manager - East.

Visit from the Doc!

Built during World War II, this historic Boeing B-29 Superfortress made two stops at Lehigh Valley International Airport (ABE) in May.

Known as, "Doc", this aircraft is one of only two remaining B-29s that are still airworthy and flying today. Flight deck and ground tours, as well as 30-minute Doc Flight Experience rides were available to the public.

"It was a technology marvel as the first high altitude, pressurized, and all electric bomber ever made, with a computerized gun system," said Josh Wells Executive Director & General Manager of Doc's Friends Inc.

Lehigh Valley International Airport (ABE) hosted the first annual Junior Fire Camp with (20) campers attending the two-day event.
